### History trip to Berlin

After a very early start and a long journey up to London on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October, Year 12 and 13 History and German students made it to Berlin. They had 5 days of activities planned that complimented their History and German studies. Saturday, they spent part of their afternoon relaxing on a boat cruise on the river Spree, reflecting at the Memorial for the murdered Jews of Europe, before finishing their evening at the Brandenburg Gate.



### Kevin Foster MP visit

On Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October - Year 12 & 13 Politics students welcomed Mr Kevin Foster MP for Torbay into school. Mr Foster spoke about his way into politics, what influenced him to join the Conservative Party, how politics works in the UK and then took a Q&A session from students on topics including the Net Zero Emissions Policy, buildings in Torbay and what constitutes an effective campaign. Ms Forster challenged him on further action to reduce sexual harassment in Torbay.

### Black History Month

It is Black History Month and along with a presentation delivered to all students in Tutor time our amazing new Year 7 students have chosen the books and put together a display for the library.



### Open Evening

Last week we hosted an Open Evening which saw a packed Dining Hall, vibrant atmosphere and lots of inquisitive primary children taking part in experiments, eagerly looking at animal organs in Biology, finding out more about how our Spanish, French & German lessons, attempting to navigate at the Ten Tors/DoE stand and trying their luck at quizzes and win prizes!



We are more popular than ever with lots of families attending one our 8 school tours which take place during the school day. The feedback from parents and students was 5\* and it is with thanks to our amazing staff and students, across all year groups, that we are able to hold these events.

### **Year 11 Geographers visited Dawlish Warren**

Our Year 11 geography students visited Dawlish Warren at the start of October to carry out fieldwork investigating the coastal processes. We had a great day in the sunshine and the students were an absolute delight although the seagulls were a different matter, they tried to steal the dog biscuits we were using to measure longshore drift! Students worked hard collecting data and learning techniques for their Paper 3 exams.



### **Year 13 History & Politics trip to London**

On the 21st and 22nd September, Year 13 History and Politics students took a trip to London to see some sights relevant to their A Level courses. After a very early start (and an academically enriching coach journey watching 20th Century Fox's Anastasia), they arrived at Westminster Abbey where they saw the tombs of monarchs they've studied, such as Henry VII, Edward VI, Mary I, and Elizabeth I, as well as memorials of other well-known figures like William Shakespeare, Jane Austen, and Stephen Hawking.



They spent the afternoon on a guided tour around the Houses

of Parliament, where they met Lord Cashman, founding chair of Stonewall and prominent LGBT rights campaigner. Later they were able to watch a live House of Lords debate and stood in the House of Commons. They then met with former TGGs student Olivia Cairns, before taking part in a workshop on political pressure groups. Day 1 ended with dinner in Central London and watching a fantastic performance of Hamilton, a musical about the American Revolutionary War.

The next day, the students had free time on Oxford Street, and some students visited 'Gay's the Word'

bookshop with Ms North for their LGBT history coursework. The

group then took a guided tour around the impressive Hampton Court Palace, once home to Cardinal Wolsey, one of Henry VIII's Lord Chancellors, and later Henry himself. The trip ended with excitement as they bumped into Geri Halliwell, better known as Ginger Spice, as she was filming promotion for her new book about Anne Boleyn.

### Kindness is valued at school

Over the last 2 weeks 5 students from each of Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 have been nominated where they have displayed *kindness* at school. These students took part in a special celebration during breaktime where they joined Ms Foster in the Sixth Form Café. With a friend to accompany them, they choose a drink, a snack and were congratulated on holding the high standards at TGGs.

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The show was performed over three nights and students from Sherwell Valley Primary and Year 7s were invited in to watch the dress rehearsal. Students, from Years 7 through to 13, performed with incredible confidence, enthusiasm, energy and humour, keeping the audience gripped and entertained throughout!
