

WHY IS DEMOCRACY IMPORTANT?



IMPORTANCE OF LIBERAL DEMOCRACY



Democracy ensures citizens get to choose the government they prefer and through elections, to influence the policies that are followed.



It ensures that the interests and demands of all minority groups are considered and are free from discrimination. This then avoids a tyranny of the majority situation.



Democracy controls state power and often disperses power by electing different levels of government – e.g. councils, mayors & nations of the UK



It ensures that power does not corrupt by making governments accountable to the people and ensuring that they submit to re-elections, and are controlled by elected representatives.

Democracy establishes and protects freedom

The French Revolution promoted the ideas of equality and ended the autocratic rule of the monarchy with a new political system which included the middle and working classes.

The American Revolution was also a battle against the British rule and the US Constitution allowed freedom of the individual within a representative democracy (although initially only for white men). No government today should be allowed to threaten freedom of the people unless they consent.

Democracy provides opportunities for popular participation and contributes to civil society
