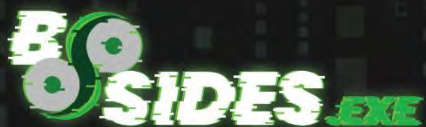

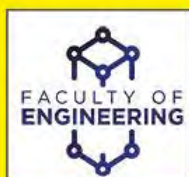

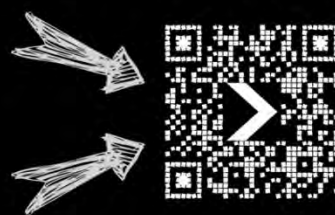

A Taste of Linguistics – Taster Day at The University of Sheffield

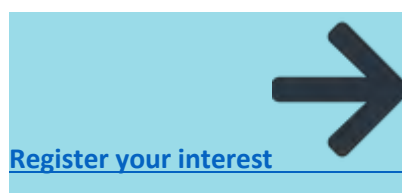
Monday 16 June 2025

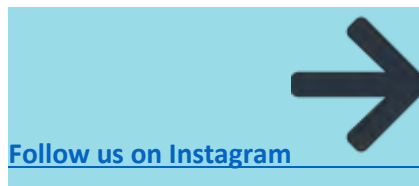

Physics Research Experience Week 2025

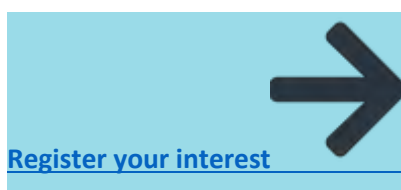

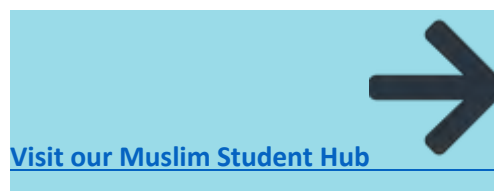
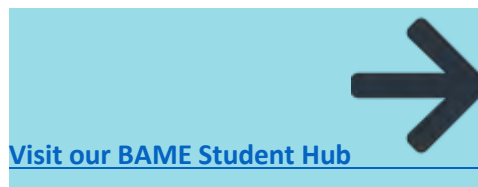

Offer Holder Days and Open Days - our Access+ Travel Bursary

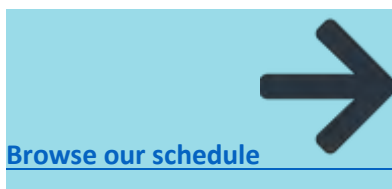

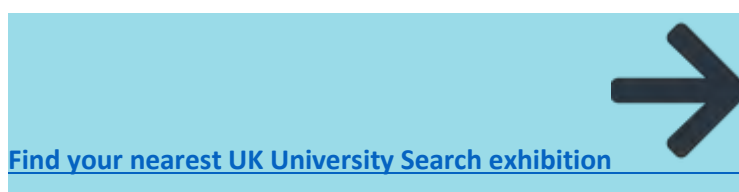
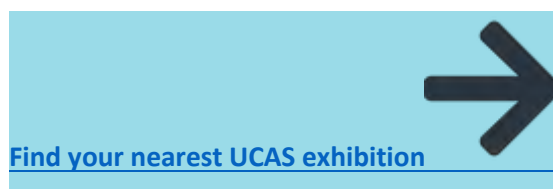

Target Oxbridge Year 12 Programme

Target Oxbridge is a free programme that aims to help Black African and Caribbean students and students of mixed race with Black African and Caribbean heritage increase their chances of getting into the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge (known collectively as Oxbridge). Since launching in 2012, Target Oxbridge has helped over 500 students to secure Oxbridge offers across its sixth form programmes. Applications have now closed but late applications will still be considered, so we would recommend applying as soon as possible.

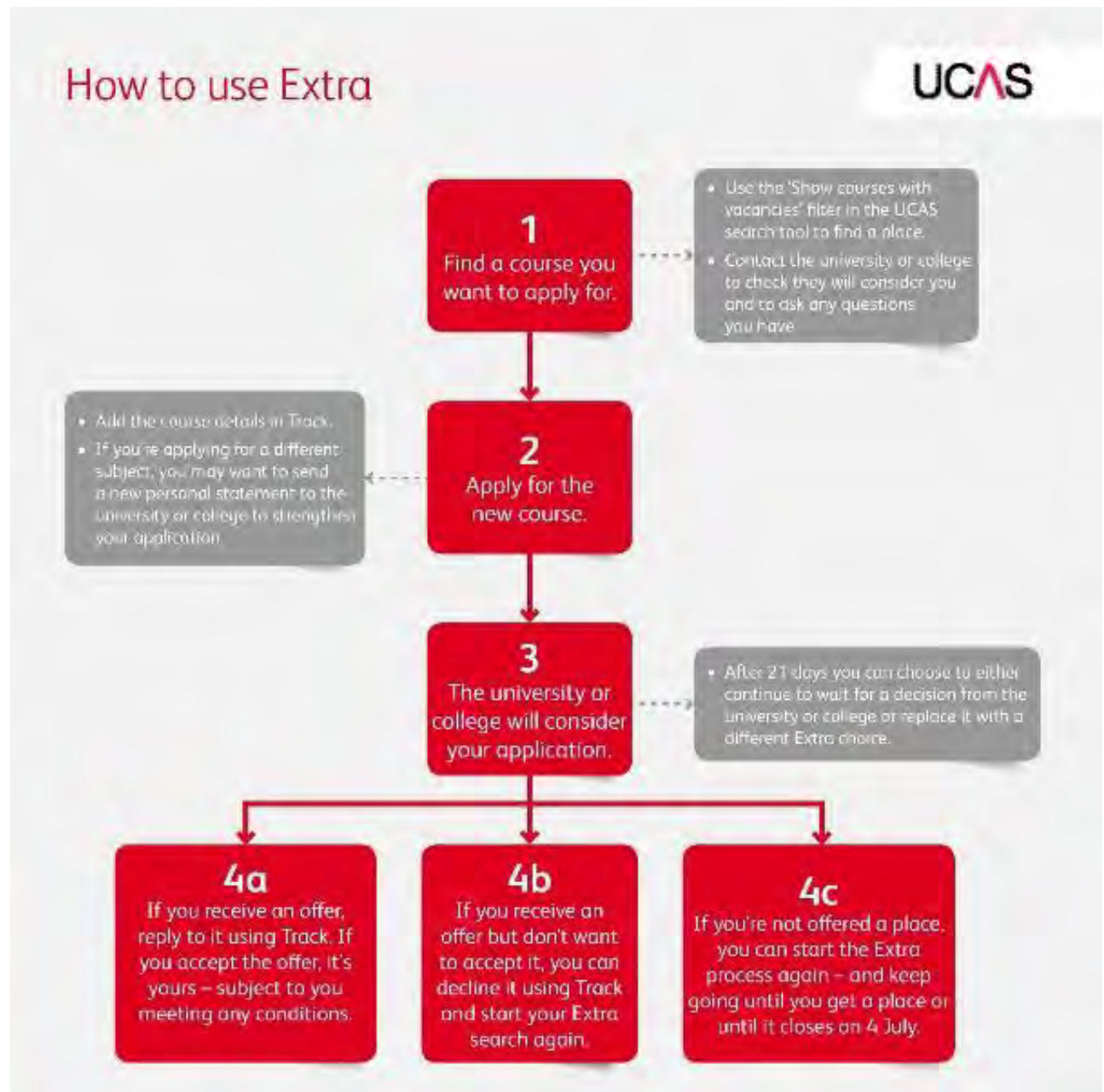
