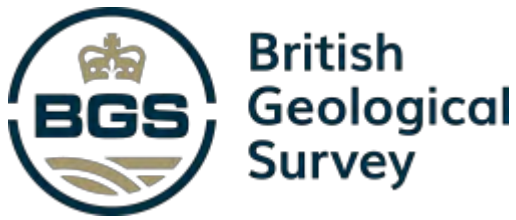

About BGS — Working with us

GS is committed to promoting awareness of careers in geoscience and developing a diverse talent pipeline of the next generation of geoscientists. As part of this commitment, we will be offering three work experience schemes that have been tailored for students at various stages of their education.

By participating, students will have the opportunity to:

- increase their understanding of the roles and disciplines within BGS and throughout the wider geological and environmental science sectors
- develop both interpersonal and scientific skills (practical or theoretical) that are essential for their educational and career development journeys
- interact with a range of professionals through webinars, video diaries or in person (programme dependent)
- have a better understanding of how to support inclusive research practices within the geological and environmental sciences
- use their knowledge and talents to contribute to resolving ongoing challenge areas, such as environmental change and multi-hazards
- receive communications on future opportunities at BGS and our research partners

Summer in-person placements

BGS currently offers a paid, six-week summer placement scheme for students who meet the following criteria:

- have the right to work in the UK
- are at least 18 years old at the time of application
- meet one of the following conditions:
 - finished their A levels (or equivalent)

- about to enter university
- are currently studying as an undergraduate student in years 1 or 2 of their geography, earth science or environmental sciences (GEES) degree

If your experience looks a little different from these criteria and you believe you can bring value to the role, we would love to learn more about you.

As part of this scheme, BGS takes up to four students to participate. This scheme is delivered by BGS at our headquarters (Keyworth, Nottinghamshire) in partnership with the School of Geography, University of Nottingham.

Please carefully read the information in this section before you apply.

- The closing date for applications is no later than 16:00 (4pm BST) on Friday 23 May 2025. Applicants will be notified of the outcome on or after Friday 30 May 2025
- The placement is expected to run for six continuous weeks between Monday 21 July and Friday 29 August 2025 (dates may be subject to change). Please ensure that you are available for these weeks

How to apply

If you would like to apply for this scheme you will need to follow a 2-stage process this year.

1. Please complete the online [BGS Summer Placement Scheme application form](#).
2. Once you have completed the online form, please send your completed CV and cover letter (maximum one page) to [Dr Keely Mills](mailto:DrKeelyMills@bgs.ac.uk) (EDITeam@bgs.ac.uk). Please ensure all filenames include your surname (for example, Mills-CV.docx, Mills-cover-letter.docx).

Your cover letter should include:

- information about you and your experience so far
- where you see your qualifications taking you
- why you are interested in a summer placement at BGS

We will not be interviewing for these positions. If the scheme is over-subscribed, all eligible applications meeting the criteria will be pooled and places allocated using a randomised approach.

Frequently asked questions

Can I send my CV and personal details when applications are closed?

Due to data protection considerations and to ensure equality of opportunities, CVs will only be considered for formally advertised and active applications. Please DO NOT send your personal details, including CVs, for speculative positions.

Is this a paid placement?

Yes. The four places available for the summer placements are paid. You will be contracted to work 30 hours per week (approximately 09:00 to 15:30). The salary for these positions will be £20 049 (pro rata). For this placement scheme, this roughly equates to an hourly rate of £10.42.

Working hours (09:00 to 15:30) are inclusive of a lunch break (unpaid) total 32.5 hours per week.

What is the location of the placement?

The placements will be hosted at the BGS headquarters in Keyworth, Nottinghamshire (NG12 5GG). You will spend one day a week based at the School of Geography, University of Nottingham (NG7 2RD). There may be an opportunity to visit the BGS offices in Edinburgh; further details will be provided as necessary.

Can I work remotely?

BGS values the ability to work flexibly and hybrid working may be an option for small components of this role. Given the nature of the placement, there are several components that will need to be undertaken in person and cannot be completed remotely.

What would a typical day look like?

Your working day will be six hours. You will be based at the BGS headquarters in Keyworth (Nottinghamshire) for four out of the five days in any week. When at BGS, a typical day could involve a two-hour (or more) interactive session with a member of BGS staff to learn about their work and, where possible, to experience and try it out for yourself!

You will then spend four hours of the day working on collaborative or independent projects. We have some projects in mind, but we are also open to your ideas and can support you in developing a project during this time.

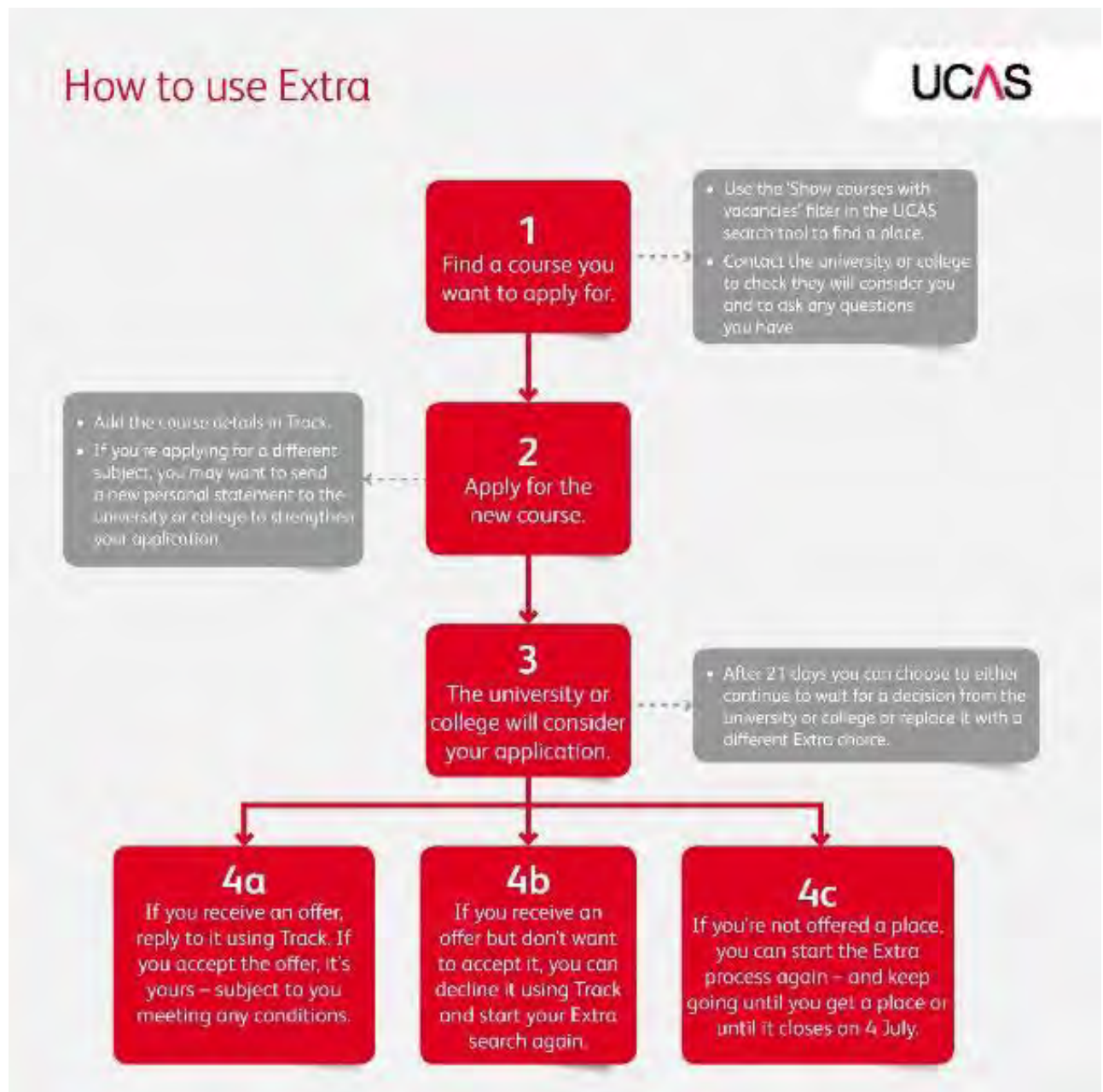
