Important Reminder for students applying for InvestIN courses.

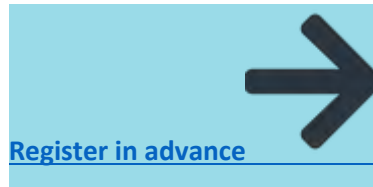

Register for Clearing

Students who are not already holding an offer with us but think they might like to study at Sheffield can register their interest before Results Day by creating a Clearing registration. By simply entering their details and telling us what courses they're interested in, we can get in touch with them on the morning of Thursday 14 August. If we have places available on the course, all they'll need to do is add their grades via an email link. Their completed application will be reviewed by our team, then we'll either call or email the student to let them know our decision.

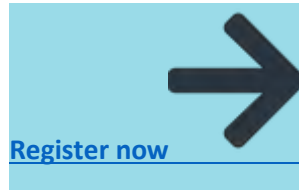

Results Day and Clearing online sessions

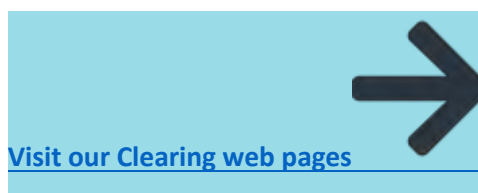

Clearing open day

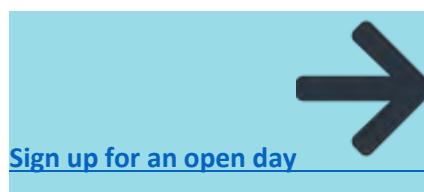

Autumn Open Days

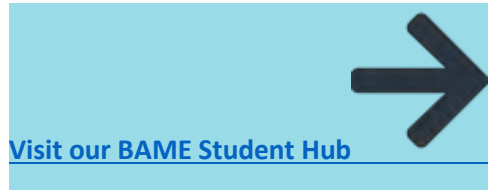

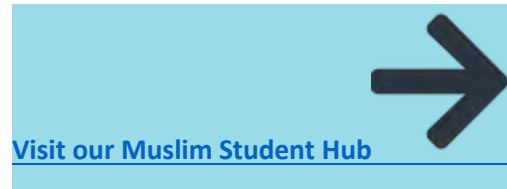


Information, advice and guidance (IAG) for BAME and Muslim Students

Results Day tips from a recent graduate

Results Day can feel overwhelming, but try not to panic. UCAS Hub is often busy in the morning, so you may need to wait to see if you've been successful. As UCAS terminology can be confusing, here's a quick reminder: an unconditional offer confirms your place (firm or insurance). If you don't meet the conditions of your offers and are unsuccessful you will then be eligible to enter Clearing. Alternatively, you may be given a change course offer from the university - a similar course, typically with lower entry requirements. If you expect to use Clearing, whether due to unexpected results, or a change of course or university, it's best to prepare early. Some universities offer pre-registration, and available courses are often listed from early July. - Susie, Student Recruitment Intern and recent graduate

Early Clearing

Our Early Clearing service is now live. This service allows students who are already holding level 3 qualifications to secure a university place before results day. We will be considering enquiries with an entry requirement of ABB-BBC at A-level, or equivalent, depending on the programme. Students can apply directly to us via our application forms:

Good News for Liverpool!

Liverpool has just broken into the top 150 in the QS World Rankings! We now sit at number 147.

The rankings, which include 1,500 of the world's leading universities, place Liverpool 20th in the Russell Group and 22nd out of 90 UK universities listed. Notably, the University has advanced 43 places over the past three years, which is a strong indicator of our sustained upward trajectory.

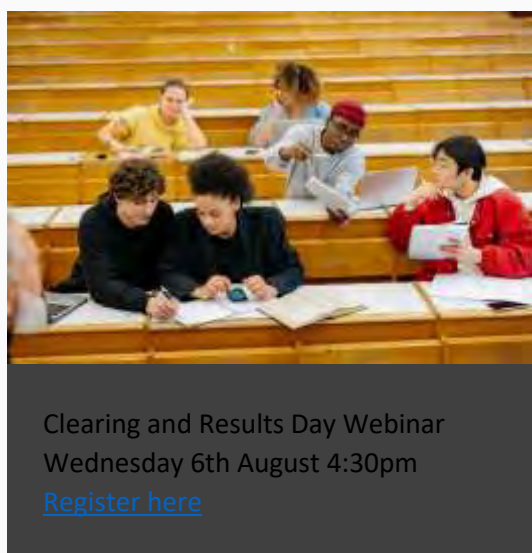
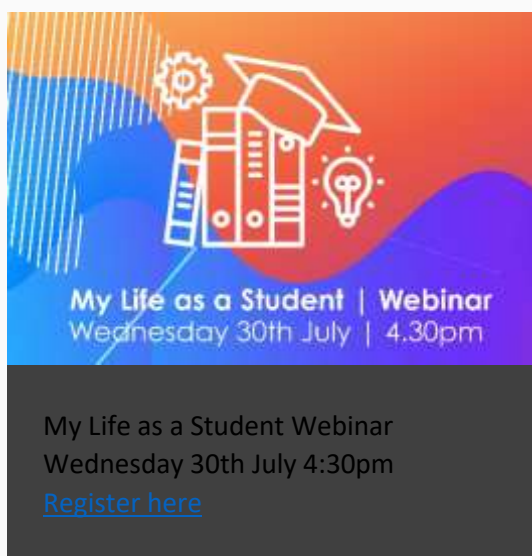

Year 13 Apply with Bath programme



Apply with Bath is a free, flexible online programme available from September 2025 that supports Year 13 students through the journey of applying to the University of Bath. Students will have the opportunity to chat with undergraduates already studying at Bath and get help with their UCAS application, including 1:1 personal statement support.

The programme offers a wealth of resources on key topics like personal statements, accommodation, scholarships, bursaries, and student finance. It's a pick-and-mix, self-paced programme — they choose the parts that are most useful to them.

We also offer specific support, advice and guidance for students who are estranged, young carers, displaced, or from a care-experienced background. We'll help them understand what support is available and how to access it, so they can feel confident and prepared for their next steps.

Apply with Bath is aimed at academically-able Year 13 students who meet our Widening Participation criteria and are planning to apply to study at the University of Bath from 2026.

To be considered for a place students will need to:

- have obtained at least six GCSEs at grades A* to B/9 to 6, and at least a grade C/4 in GCSE English and Mathematics
- be on track to achieve the required entry grades to study your chosen subject at Bath
- meet one or more of our widening participation criteria
