

Having looked at historic and current examples of anti-semitism, students were given a task to produce a reflective piece of work on anti-Semitism and how it might have been different. The quality of work produced was outstanding and thought-provoking.



Guide Dogs for the Blind (Kindness, Wellbeing)

Throughout this academic year, Year 9 have been enthusiastically raising money for Guide Dogs for the Blind; organising bake sales, a staff fashion show and a sponsored silence (to name but a few of the exciting activities). Our aim is to raise £2,500 by the end of the year, so we can sponsor a guide dog puppy from its first steps to its qualifying to be a Guide dog. If we achieve this total, we also get to choose the name of the puppy!

As a kind reciprocal gesture, representatives from the charity came into TGGs during the Year 9 exam week, to provide some well-deserved and much needed dog/puppy therapy. All the students who were invited to meet the puppies/dogs really found the experience extremely beneficial and worthwhile.
