Domestic Abuse

Since the domestic abuse act 2021, children have been recognised as victims of domestic abuse rather than just witnesses. Mrs Wilkinson and Mrs West are both domestic abuse champions and have access to a wide range of support for families through the 'reducing the risk' platform. Domestic abuse champions are individuals trained to recognise and support those experiencing domestic abuse. They form part of a growing and dynamic network of people who share a common language and knowledge around domestic abuse, and support people to safety.

In addition to this, there is a huge support network within Torbay to support families who are experiencing domestic abuse. This network, called Standing Tall, brings together multiple agencies to support families in a joined up and collaborative manner.

If you or someone you know is experiencing the impacts of domestic abuse, you can contact Standing Tall for support and they will offer you guidance and support.

Clare's Law

Clare's law allows a person to request information under the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (DVDS) application

Under Clare's Law you can:

- Apply for information about your current or ex-partner because you're worried they may have a history of abuse and are a risk to you.
- Request information about the current or ex-partner of a friend or relative because you're worried they might be at risk.
- You can also apply for this if you have had a bad experience and want to check a new partner

Anyone above the age of 16 can make this request and you can also make a request if you are concerned for a friend or family member.

Safer Internet Day 11th February 2025



At TGGS we pride ourselves with the education and support we have in place for our community to keep safe online. In a recent survey with our school council, all students agreed that the systems in place at school keep them safe online and they receive regular information on any risk they may face.

This year, the focus of Safer Internet Day is

'TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE' - protecting yourself and others from scams online.

The vast majority of young people have access to the internet either through a computer, tablet or computer, leaving them susceptible to potential scams.

In Computer Science (KS3), PSHE (KS4) and tutorial (SIXTH FORM) sessions over the next two school weeks, students will be reminded of how to spot scams, protect their personal information and remember that any organisations driving cybercrime act in a very devious and underhand manner.



Updates from the reason Torbay Educational Services forum (TESS)

Abandoned buildings



Torbay council have outlined that there are currently several abandoned buildings in the Bay.

Torquay – Bancourt Hotel / Shelly Court / Coppice Hotel / Sifam / Virginia Hotel / Debenhams / Living Coasts. Paignton – Berkley Hotel. There are many risks associated with this

- Risk of death / serious harm.
- Risks from structural issues, fire, needles, falls from height etc.
- Asbestosis risk from exposure to asbestos often found in roofs.
- Psittacosis / Cryptococcus / Histoplasmosis / Candidiasis bird droppings risk.
- Risks from others potential for multiuse by drug & alcohol users / rough sleepers / others.

They have shared this with local schools to raise awareness for families and students as a deterrent to young people entering these dangerous places.

Review of safeguarding thresholds

Torbay safeguarding children partnership are currently reviewing the safeguarding children's board safeguarding thresholds chart. These thresholds are used to determine the level of support that may be needed for a child that may be at risk of harm. Once we have had these shared with us, we will ensure all policy and process is updated and share this with all stakeholders.
