## **Compliance**

All students are expected to adhere to the above rules which will be enforced by all staff. Tutors will regularly visually check that their Tutee's uniform is correct. The following will happen should any student fail to comply without good reason (e.g. a health issue raised by their parent)

**Stage 1:** If appropriate, students will be asked immediately to remove (e.g. coloured nail varnish, piercings etc) replace (e.g. inappropriately coloured hair tie) or adjust (e.g. skirt length) the offending item.

**Stage 2:** If the above is not possible, the student will be asked to change the item overnight and present themselves in the correct uniform to a designated member of staff (usually their Tutor). If for any reason this is not possible a parent will be asked to contact the Head of Year at the school to explain why.

**Stage 3:** Students who repeatedly fail to meet the required standards will be seen by their Head of Year and parents will be contacted to decide the best way forward.
