

In the Sixth Form @TGGS, not only do we offer a broad range of subjects to study at A Level, we also provide many opportunities that will prepare you for life beyond Sixth Form, whether it be going off to university, into an apprenticeship or into the world of work.

You can create a bespoke academic experience with us at TGGS. Alongside your core A Level subjects, we also provide the opportunity for you to take complete an Extended Project Qualification and become involved in our enrichment programme.

Our enrichment programme offers many varied activities such as the Duke of Edinburgh award, Ten Tors, taking part in the Junior League of Friends, supporting students in our Hub Scheme, learning how to debate, attending masterclass lectures, joining one of our many successful societies or setting up one of your own, undertaking work experience, playing Music or Sports, as well as undertaking leadership roles such as Academic Ambassadors or being part of the Sixth Form Leadership Team. All students in Year 12 take part in enrichment and develop great pride in learning new skills and helping those in the community. Enrichment activities form a vital part of any university, apprenticeship or job application, helping you to stand out from the crowd.

The Extended Project (EPQ) is perfect for broadening your learning beyond A Levels in an area that interests and engages you. The EPQ carries more UCAS points than an AS level and is highly regarded by universities as you learn how to independently research, Harvard reference and time manage - competencies which are essential in an undergraduate degree course. We are fortunate to have specialist EPQ tutors who are senior examiners for AQA.

Throughout Years 12 and 13, we promote various opportunities which include UCAS and Oxbridge preparation, taking part in community projects overseas, work placements, interview workshops and attending various TGGS careers conferences.

But sixth form life at TGGS is not just about work; we also have lots of fun! We get involved with lots of initiatives such as Macmillan Coffee Mornings and we host a week-long school charity event every year. We have team building days and residential opportunities that not only encourage team work but promote friendship and camaraderie. There are also Sixth Form socials to take part in - cake breaks, shopping and bowling trips, a weekly quiz league as well as a Sixth Form Prom. We encourage you to relax in our Sixth Form café or use the purpose built gym. We know a healthy body and a healthy mind are important if you are to succeed in life.

The Sixth Form centre offers modern classrooms dedicated exclusively to the teaching of Year 12 and 13 students; a spacious coffee shop; a careers area and a designated ICT suite. The building is situated close to the Drama and Music block with its superb facilities and the Library (offering quiet work space throughout the day and a huge selection of books and periodicals). One of the central reasons that the Sixth Form works at TGGS is because it is placed both geographically and spiritually at the heart of the school.

OFSTED

For us, statistics matter less than helping the wonderful young people we work with to fulfil their potential; we remain dedicated to caring, whether that be through creating high expectations or offering one-to-one support.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

We offer the 16-19 Bursary which is financial support allocated by the government for payment to those students who are identified as being in need. If you are facing financial difficulties and are aged under 19 on 31st August in the academic year in which you start your programme of study, you may be eligible to receive bursary support. Applications can be made to the Learner Support Bursary once you have begun your A level studies with us. The bursary can be used to pay for items such as laptops, textbooks and travel.

PASTORAL SUPPORT & THE TUTORIAL PROGRAMME

All students are assigned a form tutor with whom they meet daily for registration and form time. Tutors are responsible for overseeing academic progress and providing pastoral care. There are approximately 20-25 students in each tutor group and every sixth form student has regular 1 to 1 mentoring with their tutor. Mrs Keen is Head of Year 12, and as a non-teaching Head of Year, she is always available to offer pastoral support to students. In addition, all Sixth Form students have access to the school's SEND and Counselling support.

There is a weekly tutorial session that explores a wide range of topics, including careers guidance, study skills, healthy relationships, and life beyond school. These sessions are designed to provide students with the support and advice they need to thrive academically, personally, and socially as they grow into confident young adults.

HOUSE SYSTEM

All Sixth Form students belong to one of six houses, which span all year groups across the school. This vertical structure fosters a strong sense of community and ensures that the Sixth Form remains closely connected to the wider school. Our vibrant house culture is a source of pride, with a rich programme of events and competitions that encourage teamwork and school spirit. Sixth Form students play a key role in leading their houses, with opportunities to serve as Heads of House and members of the Sixth Form Leadership Team, developing valuable leadership skills and acting as inspiring role models for younger pupils.

The choice of which A Levels to study should be based on a mixture of three things:

- What you enjoy the most this is really important as you will need to fully immerse yourself in your subjects and engage in super curricular study;
- What you are best at this can really help facilitate your ability to achieve your full potential and maximise your grade potential;
- What you need for your chosen career e.g. to become a Physiotherapist you usually need to gain a Biology A level.

All of our students take three A Level subjects chosen from our extensive range.

The Extended Project

The Level 3 Extended Project known as the EPQ

Students are taught the study skills needed for the EPQ, supporting coursework (NEAs) in other subjects. They are encouraged to complete the Level 3 Extended Project.

This is essentially an opportunity for individual students to choose a topic from any area of interest and then to work with a designated supervisor to produce either a 5000 word style dissertation, or an artefact (painting, model etc.). Pursuing this qualification allows the student to take real ownership of their project, choosing both the area researched and the mode in which this research is conveyed. It is high-level work carried out independently; there is no checking of rough drafts but there is consultative guidance. Some students choose to study an area related to their chosen Higher Education course, whilst others pursue an interest that they are passionate about.

Past topics include: an analysis of the structural failure of the titanic, an art portfolio documenting a hip joint surgery and recovery, a short documentary film on teenage body image on social media, building a playground in a Sri Lankan hospital, and setting up a historical murder mystery.

The students are supported through the process by:

- A series of taught skills lectures and seminars;
- Watching presentations by Year 13 students on their chosen topics;
- One-to-one mentoring with staff supervisors who provide guidance and support throughout the process;
- Designated time in the curriculum to undertake independent research.

This exciting opportunity allows students the opportunity to research a topic of interest to them, and not only is this highly motivating – as we have seen with our present Year 13 – but is looked on very favourably by universities as evidence of independent learning beyond that normally offered by potential applicants. Some universities are prepared to be flexible with reduced A Level offers if students perform highly in their EPQ.

Enrichment

Community and Wellbeing Enrichment

The Enrichment Programme will happen throughout Sixth Form, primarily during Year 12.

All students will take part in academic, community and wellbeing enrichment. As a school we provide an array of opportunities and activities for the students to participate in.

Academic Enrichment:

In addition to the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), students have the opportunity to join or establish their own academic societies. Some of our most successful examples include MEDSOC, LAWSOC, and our thriving Model United Nations. Students can also take on leadership roles as Subject Ambassadors, organising guest speakers, competitions, and enrichment events to inspire others across the school. In Year 12, students may also become Academic Mentors through our Peer Mentoring Hub, supporting younger pupils at Key Stage 3 and GCSE in their areas of expertise.

Community Enrichment:

Our sixth form students give back to the whole school community through their community enrichment, as well as taking on key leadership roles (more on this overleaf) they can also become a wellbeing ambassador, or volunteer and fundraise for the Junior Leage of Friends. Our Sixth Formers also run our annual charity week, and help to run our sponsored walk, which raises thousands of pounds every year for our sister school Imprezza in Kenya. These experiences allow students to develop leadership skills, give back, and make a lasting difference both locally and globally.

Wellbeing enrichment

Sixth Form students at TGGS also take part in activities that support their physical and mental wellbeing. Students can engage with a range of activities, whatever suits them, this may include utilising our purpose built fitness suite, taking part in the school productions, singing in the choirs, attending the running club or taking part in sports include football, rugby and gymnastics. We also have an established and vibrant outdoor education programme which can include Ten Tors and The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, these activities build not only crucial teamwork and leadership skills, but also resilience.

LEADERSHIP

One aspect of TGGS that may distinguish us from other schools is our focus on the development of leadership. We work really hard to nurture the kind of self-belief needed to be successful in today's work place. This is achieved through our school ethos and curriculum, as well as the many opportunities that we provide for our students to undertake leadership roles.

Students have the opportunity to join the Sixth Form Leadership Team; a pivotal role is the position of Head Girl. Other key opportunities include being a member of the Heads of House team, promoting and encouraging a strong house culture throughout school; running the HUB scheme and leading and organising in-house academic and pastoral support for the lower years. Students are also able to work closely with Heads of Departments as Academic Ambassadors, promoting and supporting learning in their subjects. This list is not exhaustive of the activities that students can take part in, but provides an insight into the kind of opportunities that we make available to them. We also run a highly successful Duke of Edinburgh programme and regularly enter teams in the annual Ten Tors Competition, encouraging leadership and resilience.

If our students have the skills to develop into the leaders of tomorrow, but lack the confidence to flourish, then we believe that taking on roles and responsibilities such as those mentioned above will help to change that.

OXBRIDGE APPLICANTS

As applying to Oxbridge is a demanding and at first sight bewildering experience, we offer a preparatory programme, which helps to facilitate students throughout the application process. The detailed programme includes:

- Visits to both universities:
- Detailed analysis of the colleges their strengths and ratio of applicants from private/state schools, and in different subjects:
- Individual help all students receive tailored advice;
- Interview practice from Oxbridge graduates and members of the Senior Leadership Team.
- A dedicated member of staff to support each student.

APPRENTICESHIPS

AT TGGS, we support students aiming for highly competitive, top-tier degree apprenticeships—programmes that allow them to earn a university degree while gaining hands-on work experience. Our Sixth Formers have successfully secured apprenticeships with a range of prestigious employers, including the Government as Apprentice Economists, Kier Group, a leading construction, infrastructure, and services company, and Siemens in project management. We provide personalised one-to-one guidance throughout the application process, including CV support, interview preparation, and tailored advice to help students present their skills and achievements with confidence.

THE CAREERS PROGRAMME

The careers programme we offer aims to give independent, impartial advice to all our students.

Some of its key components are:

- Individual interviews with highly knowledgeable and approachable independent Careers Advisors.
- Access to UNIFROG an online portal for both students and parents giving full details on university courses throughout the UK, live apprenticeships and MOOCS (Massive Open Online Courses) on a wide range of subjects which students can complete free of charge;
- Talks on non-university options after A Levels such as higher level degree apprenticeships;
- Talks by university subject specialists;
- Mock interview practice;
- Support with work-experience placements throughout the Sixth Form.
- Visits by apprenticeship providers
- Weekly newsletters from the Head of Careers

MEDICAL/VETERINARY/DENTISTRY PROGRAMME

We have a specific programme designed to support those who wish to pursue a career in a medically related field such as Medics, Vets, Dentists, Nurses, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists, Pharmacists, Chemists, Opticians and Midwives. The programme involves:

- Early guidance on the types of activities that would aid a successful application;
- Formal application preparation sessions;
- The opportunity to undertake an Extended Project on a career-related subject;
- Internal interview programme which includes up to three
 1:1 interviews with a senior member of staff.
- 1:1 support from an experienced member of staff

We run a successful MEDSOC that enables students to research and discuss current medical and ethical scenarios in a problem solving setting. In previous years, we have hosted Operating Theatre Live at our school, a learning experience based around the dissection of real anatomical specimens in an operating theatre environment.

"The preparation and support for University applications was brilliant. The staff were fantastic at explaining the application process and were always there to answer any questions we had. When we actually put in our applications, the one-to-one sessions with my Personal Statement mentor were extremely useful, especially as I found this aspect of the application quite difficult. The support doesn't stop as soon as the application goes in either, for those with interviews at their universities, lots of advice sessions and mock interviews were available, both of which I personally found very helpful, and I think did a good job at preparing me for my interviews."




