We often get asked what our students do beyond InvestIN, so last year, we embarked on a comprehensive survey of our alumni to uncover the answer. We are excited to share with you these results, alongside a deep dive into the stories of our alumni students.

Highlights from our survey:



80% of respondents said that our programmes helped them decide what career to pursue.

This camp represents a thrilling opportunity to unite students from across the globe and professionals from diverse engineering backgrounds. We aim to provide an enriching and educational week, comprising classes, workshops, masterclasses, visits to companies and labs, as well as recreational activities. The primary objective of this camp is to enable participants to delve into the realm of engineering, refine their technical skills, cultivate their professional networks, and foster the exchange of knowledge in a welcoming environment.

We invite you to share our announcement with your students as registration is now ongoing.

The camp will run from July 1st to July 8th. Although a second session from July 8th to July 15th was initially planned, please note that there are no longer any available spots for this session.

The cost of the residential program is 2'700 Swiss Francs (with potential discounts available for specific cases). It would normally cover:

a. Course material: All necessary building materials, lab supplies, and protective equipment for handson engineering projects.

b. Masterclasses, conferences, lectures: engaging and informative sessions led by experts in various engineering disciplines, offering valuable insights and knowledge.

c. School facilities: Access to state-of-the art facilities such as sports, halls, classrooms, and catering facilities for a comprehensive learning experience.

d. Accommodation: nearby accommodation (hotels), ensuring a convenient and immersive stay during the summer camp.

e. On-site Wi-Fi: Reliable internet connectivity to support research, communication, and online learning throughout the camp.

- f. Meals: three freshly prepared meals and an afternoon snack are provided each day.
- g. T-shirts/hoodies and gadgets.
- h. Social activities, sightseeing tours, sports events, games
- i. Transportation only during the camp program and with respect to the camp schedule and program
- j. Certificate of participation


We know this year can be daunting for a variety of different reasons, therefore we have added below our three top tips for making the most of this year!
